

IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE MATTER VACATING PRIOR ADMINISTRATIVE **ORDERS**

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2021-02

AMITA MINITED BOOKS OF THE SECONDARY

WHEREAS, on March 12, 2020, Governor Sisolak declared a state of emergency in Nevada in response to the COVID-19 pandemic;

WHEREAS, prior Administrative Orders closed the courthouse to the public and limited court proceedings to remote Zoom trials and hearings;

WHEREAS, with the ongoing vaccination of the public and the success of other preventative measures, the risk of catching the virus is decreasing;

WHEREAS, the Truckee Meadows COVID Risk Meter has generally shown a declining risk to the public;

WHEREAS, prior Administrative Orders have closed the courthouse to the public but that all available data as well as the easing of statewide restrictions shows that it is time to begin the process of opening the Sparks Justice Court for business, but that prior Orders need to be rescinded or modified accordingly; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge of the Sparks Justice Court has the authority pursuant to NRS 4.157(c) to make administrative decisions pertaining to the business of the Court.

AND GOOD CAUSE BEING SHOWN,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. Amended Administrative Order 2020-2, closing the Sparks Justice Court to public access, is hereby rescinded and replaced with a phased reopening plan that will be adopted in Administrative Order 2021-03 issued simultaneously with this Order.

- 2. Administrative Order 2020-04, establishing procedures for prompt bail hearings pursuant to Valdez-Jimenez v. Eighth Judicial District Court, 136 Nev. 155, 460 P.3d 976 (2020), remains in full force and effect.
- 3. Administrative Order 2020-5, establishing remote trial and hearing procedures, is rescinded and superseded by Administrative Order 2021-03.
- 4. Administrative Order 2020-6, establishing procedures in small claims and civil cases, is hereby rescinded and superseded by Administrative Order 2021-03. The availability to hold civil jury trials will depend on how soon the District Court Jury Commissioner is able to call venires for the justice courts and how soon the criminal jury backlog is resolved.
- 5. Administrative Order 2020-8, rescinding prior Administrative Orders, remains in effect. The portions of the Order staying certain evictions will remain in effect only as long as a federal CDC or Nevada eviction moratorium is extended past the current expiration date of March 31, 2021.
- 6. Administrative Order 2020-9, concerning the use of the Sparks Justice Court's revised eviction forms and procedures related thereto, remains in full force and effect.
- 7. Administrative Order 2020-10, tentatively establishing reopening procedures and vacating in-person trials, is rescinded and superseded by Administrative Order 2021-03.
- 8. The Court will continue to monitor the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic and will further relax courthouse access and increase scheduling as appropriate but with the reservation that any sudden spikes in the Truckee Meadows COVID Risk Meter, positive tests, and/or hospital admissions or deaths may require the closure of the Court to the public.

This Administrative Order 2021-02 shall stay in full force and effect until amended or rescinded by the Sparks Justice Court. IT IS SO ORDERED.
