- Builds inclusion and helps take down walls of disability.

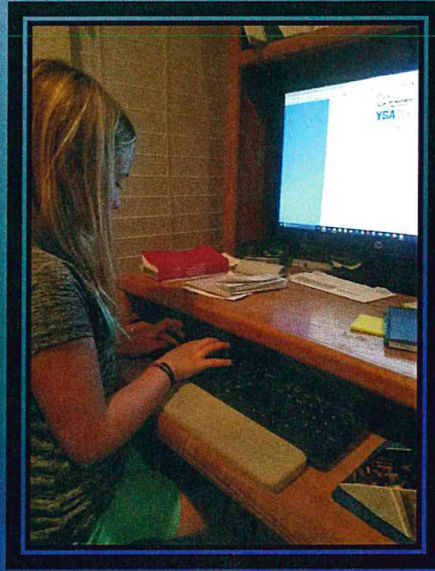
