Bill Number	Description of Legislation/Notes
AB39	<p><i>Revises provisions governing the appointment of representatives to a governing board for regional planning in certain counties. (BDR 22-433)</i></p> <p>Summary: Changes the composition of the Truckee Meadows Regional Planning Governing Board and allows Washoe County to select its representatives to governing board.</p>
AB45	<p><i>Revises provisions relating to public office.</i></p> <p>Summary: Defines the term “voter registration drive” among other items. It would require training and accountability for people who work registration drives to decrease illegible, duplicate and incomplete voter registration forms.</p>
SB176	<p><i>Revises provisions relating to public safety. (BDR 23-666)</i></p> <p>Summary: Mandates law enforcement body cameras; allows increase in 911 surcharge as funding mechanism.</p>
AB194	<p><i>Provides for the certification of behavioral healthcare peer recovery support specialist.</i></p> <p>Summary: An act relating to professions; providing for the certification of behavioral healthcare peer recovery support specialists by the Board of Examiners for Alcohol, Drug and Gambling Counselors; providing penalties; and providing other matters properly relating thereto. Cross roads has been asked to testify.</p>
SB315	<p><i>Revises provisions relating to waste disposal.</i></p> <p>Summary: This bill would create a mandate for the amount of recycling that is required by a county, creating a commission to regulate and report the amount of recycling that is occurring. If that mandated amount is not meet the County would be forced to pay a fine for not meeting that standard.</p>
SB352	<p><i>Revises provisions governing the taxation of property after a natural disaster.</i></p> <p>Summary: Revises provisions governing the taxation of property after a natural disaster. The bill would support homeowners who lose all or part of their homes to a natural disaster to keep their property depreciation amount, if they meet other requirements. This bill would specifically help Lemmon Valley and Little Valley fire victims.</p>
