Bill	Description
AB32	<p>Revises provisions governing pest control. (BDR: 49-176)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requires certain persons who engage in pest control, including government agencies and their employees to obtain a license from the Director of the State Department of Agriculture. Establishes procedures relating to such licensure and providing penalties to those not in compliance.</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Natural Resources, Agriculture and Mining on March 2</p>
AB39	<p>Revises provisions governing the appointment of representatives to a governing board for regional planning in certain counties. (BDR: 22-433)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Changes the representation on the Regional Planning Board to 3 members from each local governing body. Also allows the County to determine their own representation on the Regional Planning Board.</p> <p>Status: Referred to Assembly Government Affairs, Scheduled to be heard on March 7</p>
AB45	<p>Revises provisions relating to public office.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requires training and accountability for people who work registration drives to decrease illegible, duplicate and incomplete voter registration forms.</p> <p>Status: Referred to Assembly Committee on Legislative Operations and Elections</p>
AB55	<p>Revises provisions relating to evidence collected from and the reimbursement of payment for forensic medical examinations of victims of sexual assault. (BDR: 15-387)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requires law enforcement agencies to submit sexual assault forensic evidence kits to a forensic laboratory within a certain amount of time.</p> <p>Status: Referred to Assembly Judiciary</p>
AB97	<p>Revises provisions relating to evidence collected from forensic medical examinations of victims of sexual assaults.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requires law enforcement agencies to submit sexual assault forensic evidence kits to a forensic laboratory within a certain</p> <p>Status: Referred to Assembly Judiciary</p>
AB120	<p>Revises provisions relating to school construction.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Creates a residential school construction tax and extends the time period for school districts to develop land that they acquire through new developments.</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Government Affairs on March 1</p>

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AB121	<p>Makes various changes relating to collective bargaining between local government employers and employee organizations. (BDR: 23-621)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Prohibits a local government from unilaterally implementing changes in terms and conditions of employment during a period of time.</p> <p>Status: Referred to Assembly Government Affairs</p>
AB140	<p>Revises the boundary line between Carson City and Washoe County. (BDR: S-696)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Moves the County boundary line to move 12 mostly developed parcels from Washoe County into Carson City.</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Government Affairs on March 14</p>
AB153	<p>Requires counties to pay impact fees to certain local governments for certain costs incurred as a result of projects of intercounty significance. (BDR:22-796)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requiring counties to determine whether projects are projects of intercounty significance and requiring counties to pay impact fees to certain local governments for some costs incurred as result of the project that has intercounty significance.</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Government Affairs on March 10</p>
AB163	<p>Revises provisions governing certain short-term loans.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requires a licensee to verify the ability of the customer to repay the loan before issuing a loan. Increases the grace period before a customer can obtain a second short-term loan.</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Commerce and Labor on March 15</p>
AB194	<p>Provides for the certification of behavioral healthcare peer recovery support specialist.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Providing certification for behavioral healthcare peer recovery support.</p> <p>Status: Scheduled to be heard in Assembly Commerce and Labor on April 3</p>
AB222	<p>Revises provisions governing payday loans, title loans and installment loans.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Restricts those who are eligible for short-term loans, requires a stronger review</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Commerce and Labor on March 15</p>
AB271	<p>Revises provisions governing collective bargaining by local employers.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Would make the findings and award of a fact finder concerning employee organizations final and binding.</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Government Affairs on March 23</p>

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<p>AB297</p> <p>Requires certain local governments to designate sites for person to meet in order to complete the sale of personal property that was initiated on the Internet.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requires local governments to designate at least 1 law enforcement location to have a designated area for people to meet and conduct their ecommerce sales.</p> <p>Status: Amend and Do Pass out of Assembly Government Affairs on April 6</p>
<p>AB308</p> <p>Revises provisions relating to legislative matters.</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Authorizes a legislator to request a disparate impact statement estimating the effect of a bill on certain persons.</p> <p>Status: Scheduled to be heard in Assembly Legislative Operations and Elections on April 11</p>
<p>AB349</p> <p>Requires the Legislative Auditor to conduct a performance and compliance audit of the Incline Village General Improvement District. (BDR S-585)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Requires Legislative Auditor to conduct audit of the Incline Village Improvement District service plan of the District with no financial obligation of IVGID or Washoe County</p> <p>Status: Referred to Ways and Means Committee</p>
<p>AB379</p> <p>Amends provisions relating to general improvement districts created for the purpose of furnishing recreational facilities</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Amends existing law to enable a board of county commissioners to organize a general improvement district that includes real property without conditions and if within 7 miles from boundary of incorporated city or unincorporated town and will furnish recreational facilities.</p> <p>Status: Heard in Assembly Government Affairs on March 28th</p>
<p>SB8</p> <p>Revises provisions relating to presentence and general investigations and reports. (BDR: 14-439)</p> <p><u>Summary:</u> Reduces the amount due to be paid by the County for presentence investigation reports to 30% instead of the 70% we currently pay. Further authorizes the County at its own expense to assume the duty of preparing a presentence or general investigation and report from the Division.</p> <p>Status: Amend and Do Pass out of Senate Judiciary on March 16</p>

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<p>SB9 Revises provisions relating to presentence and general investigations and reports. (BDR: 14-437) <u>Summary:</u> Authorizes a county to enter into an agreement with the Division to pay the total cost of the county's presentence or general investigations and reports. Keeps the presentence investigation reports at 70% paid by the County. Status: Amend and Do Pass out of Senate Judiciary on March 16</p>
<p>SB17 Revises provisions governing payday lending. <u>Summary:</u> Requires the Commissioner of Financial Institutions to develop, implement and maintain a database storing information related to short-term loans issues to customers in Nevada. Status: Heard in Senate Commerce, Labor and Energy on February 22</p>
<p>SB176 Revises provisions relating to public safety. (BDR: 23-666) <u>Summary:</u> Requires that law enforcement employees who routinely interact with the public wear body cameras. Status: Amend and Do Pass out of Senate Government Affairs on March 22</p>
<p>SB271 Makes various changes relating to water. <u>Summary:</u> Requires the State Engineer to continue to allow withdrawals of groundwater from domestic wells for certain purposes where withdrawals have been restricted to conform to priority rights. Status: Amend and Do Pass out of Senate Natural Resources on April 6</p>
<p>SB272 Makes various changes relating to water. <u>Summary:</u> Authorizes the State Engineer to limit withdrawals from new domestic wells in certain basins. Status: Heard in Senate Natural Resources on March 28</p>
<p>SB315 Revises provisions relating to waste disposal. <u>Summary:</u> Requires reporting to amount of solid waste that is recycled in a County and mandates what that amount must be, if the mandated amount is not met it would require the governing body to pay a fine to the State Environmental Commission. Status: Heard in Senate Natural Resources on March 30</p>
<p>SB352 Revises provisions governing the taxation of property rebuilt after a natural disaster. <u>Summary:</u> Makes changes to the calculation of property taxes imposed on single-family residences that are being replaced after a natural disaster is declared by the Governor. Status: Heard in Senate Revenue and Economic Development on March 28</p>
