**NOTICE OF COUNTY ORDINANCE**  
In accordance with Chapter 296 of the 1955 statutes of the State of Nevada, NOTICE is hereby given that an ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT PHOTOGRAPHERS IN WASHOE COUNTY OBTAIN A LICENSE FROM WASHOE COUNTY BEFORE SOLICITING BUSINESS IN WASHOE COUNTY; REQUIRING POSTING OF A BOND BY TRANSIENT PHOTOGRAPHERS; APPOINTING THE WASHOE COUNTY SHERIFF TO ISSUE THE LICENSES; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO, was proposed on October 20th, 1955 by Commissioner Peterson; final action of adoption taken on November 5th, 1955 by the following vote:

5 AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING THAT PHOTOGRAPHERS  
6 IN WASHOE COUNTY OBTAIN A LICENSE FROM  
7 WASHOE COUNTY BEFORE SOLICITING BUSINESS  
8 IN WASHOE COUNTY; REQUIRING POSTING OF A  
9 BOND BY TRANSIENT PHOTOGRAPHERS; APPOINTING  
THE WASHOE COUNTY SHERIFF TO ISSUE THE  
LICENSES; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATION  
OF THIS ORDINANCE; AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY  
RELATED THERETO.

10 THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE  
11 DO ORDAIN:

12 SECTION 1. Definitions. As used in this act, unless  
13 the context requires otherwise:

14 1. The term "Photographer" means any person engaged in  
15 the business of taking pictures or views by or with photo-  
16 graphic equipment, whether the business is carried on as a  
17 sideline to the sale of merchandise other than pictures or  
18 solely carried on for the purpose of dealing in pictures. It  
19 shall also include persons engaged in the business of engrav-  
20 ing, enlarging, retouching or reconditioning photographs.

21 2. The term "transient photographer" means any itinerant  
22 photographer, picture or viewtaker, coupon salesman, enlarg-  
23 ment solicitor, or canvasser therefor, whose place of business  
24 is outside the State of Nevada, or who represents a person  
25 engaged in business outside of the State of Nevada, or who  
26 has no permanent fixed place of business in the State of  
27 Nevada.

28 3. The term "resident photographer" means any person  
29 who has a permanent fixed place of business in the State of  
30 Nevada.

1           4. The term "permanent fixed place of business" means  
 2 a room, rooms or studio ordinarily kept open to the public  
 3 during regular business hours at which there is in attend-  
 4 ance during such hours a photographer, or an employee thereof,  
 5 and at which there is kept photographic equipment for the  
 6 purpose of taking, developing and finishing pictures.

7           SECTION 2. Licenses Required: Fees.

8           1. Any resident person conducting the business of  
 9 photography in any unincorporated area in Washoe County  
 10 shall first obtain a license so to do from the Sheriff of  
 11 Washoe County.

12           2. Any person engaging in the business or occupation  
 13 of a transient photographer within any unincorporated area  
 14 of Washoe County shall first obtain a license from the  
 15 Sheriff of Washoe County, the license fee to be in the sum  
 16 of \$2.50 per day.

17           SECTION 3. Bond. Any person who has not engaged in the  
 18 business of photography in any unincorporated area of Washoe  
 19 County for a period of 1 year immediately prior to filing an  
 20 application for license as provided for in this act shall  
 21 furnish a bond to Washoe County. The bond shall be approved  
 22 by the District Attorney and shall be in the sum of \$500,  
 23 conditioned for the payment of the license fees in this act  
 24 provided, and shall be further conditioned that all goods,  
 25 wares and merchandise will be as represented and that the  
 26 purchase price will be refunded on any article sold which is  
 27 not represented and shall be further conditioned that final  
 28 delivery of any pictures ordered will be made in accordance  
 29 with the terms of this act, and, if not so made, the advance  
 30 payment on the order shall be refunded. Any person aggrieved

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by the action of any photographer furnishing a bond shall have a right of action on the bond for the money paid to the photographer by him or for damages or both.

SECTION 4. Soliciting Without Invitation a Nuisance.

The practice of going in and upon private premises, grounds or residences, business establishments or offices, in any unincorporated area of Washoe County, Nevada, by solicitors or canvassers endeavoring to secure, or securing, orders for the sale, distribution or gifts of photographic work of any nature by means of coupons, or otherwise, without first having been requested or invited so to do by the owner or owners, or occupant or occupants, of the private residence, grounds or premises, business establishments or offices is hereby declared to be a nuisance.

SECTION 5. Penalties. Any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall, upon conviction, be punished by a fine of not more than \$500, or by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than 6 months, or by both fine and imprisonment.

SECTION 6. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective upon passage and approval.
