The Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County, Nevada met in regular session in full conformity with law and the by-laws and rules of said Board at the regular place of meeting in the County Court House in Reno, Washoe County, Nevada, on THURSDAY, the 5th. day of June, 1958, at 10:00 o'clock A.M.

Commissioner Peterson introduced an Ordinance, which ordinance was read in full and is as follows:

SUMMARY --- An ordinance providing for the submission at the primary election on September 2, 1958, of the question of authorizing the issuance of general obligation bonds of the County to defray in part the cost of acquiring, constructing and equipping a county court house and jail, and also the submission at the same election of the question of authorizing the

issuance of general obligation bonds of the County to defray in part the cost of acquiring, constructing and equipping a juvenile detention home, and prescribing details in connection therewith.

ORDINANCE No. 59

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION, AT THE PRIMARY ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE COUNTY OF WASHOE AND STATE OF NEVADA ON THE 2ND DAY OF SEPTEMBER, 1958, TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF SAID COUNTY, OF THE QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF THE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY IN THE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$2,000,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING IN PART THE COST OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING AND EQUIPPING A COUNTY COURT HOUSE AND JAIL IN RENO, NEVADA, AND ALSO THE SUBMISSION AT THE SAME ELECTION OF THE QUESTION OF AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF THE GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE COUNTY IN THE AGGREGATE PRINCIPAL AMOUNT OF \$200,000.00 FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING IN PART THE COST OF ACQUIRING, CONSTRUCTING AND EQUIPPING A JUVENILE DETENTION HOME; DEFINING THE QUALIFICATIONS OF ELECTORS; PROVIDING FOR THE GIVING OF NOTICE OF THE ELECTION, THE MANNER OF CONDUCTING THE SAME AND OTHER DETAILS IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; PRESCRIBING THE FORM OF SAID NOTICE AND OF THE VOTING MACHINE BALLOT LABELS AND THE PAPER BALLOTS TO BE USED AT SAID ELECTION; RATIFYING ACTION PREVIOUSLY TAKEN IN CONNECTION THEREWITH; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the County of Washoe, in the State of Nevada, is a county incorporated and operating under the laws of the State of Nevada; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of said County has determined, and does hereby determine, that it is necessary and for the best interests of the County of Washoe and the inhabitants thereof that the County defray in part the cost of acquiring, constructing and equipping a county court house and jail in Reno by the authorization, issuance and sale of its general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$2,000,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, pursuant to Chapter 30, Statutes of Nevada, 1957, and all laws thereunto enabling; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of said County has determined, and does hereby further determine, that it is necessary and for the best interests of the County of Washoe and the inhabitants thereof that the County defray in part the cost of acquiring, constructing and equipping a juvenile detention home by the authorization, issuance and sale of its general obligation bonds in the aggregate principal amount of \$200,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, pursuant to Chapter 67, Statutes of Nevada, 1957, and all laws thereunto enabling; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has determined, and does hereby determine, that it is necessary and advisable to submit the proposals for issuing said bonds to a vote of the qualified electors of the County of Washoe at the primary election on September 2, 1958, in the manner provided by the statutes of the State of Nevada, and in particular NRS 350.010 to 350.200, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto; and

WHEREAS, due to the necessity of immediately placing orders for material and equipment, and in order to comply with the statutes of the State of Nevada governing the holding of said election, the Board of County Commissioners has determined, and does hereby declare and determine, that an emergency exists requiring this ordinance to take effect from and after its passage and publication by title in accordance with law.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE, IN THE STATE OF NEVADA, DOES ORDAIN:

Section 1. That, subject to the approval of the qualified electors, the County of Washoe, in the State of Nevada, proposes to issue all of the bonds described in the proposals hereinafter set forth.

Section 2. That at the time of the primary election to be held in the County of

Washoe on Tuesday, the 2nd day of September, 1958, the following proposals will be submitted to the qualified electors of the County, as hereinafter defined, which proposals are as follows, to-wit:

PROPOSAL NUMBER ONE - COUNTY COURT HOUSE AND JAIL BONDS

Shall the County of Washoe, in the State of Nevada, be authorized to issue its negotiable, coupon, general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$2,000,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of defraying in part the cost of acquiring, constructing and equipping a county court house and jail in Reno, Nevada, said bonds to bear interest at a rate of not more than five per centum per annum, and to mature serially commencing not later than three years and ending not later than twenty years from their date, as authorized by Chapter 30, Statutes of Nevada, 1957?

PROPOSAL NUMBER TWO - JUVENILE DETENTION HOME BONDS

Shall the County of Washoe, in the State of Nevada, be authorized to issue its negotiable, coupon, general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$200,000.00, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of defraying in part the cost of acquiring, constructing and equipping a juvenile detention home, said bonds to bear interest at a rate of not more than five per centum per annum, and to mature serially commencing not later than three years and ending not later than twenty years from their date, as authorized by Chapter 67, Statutes of Nevada, 1927?

Section 3. That voting machines will be used at said election for voting, registering and counting votes cast, pursuant to NRS 303.010 to 303.535, both inclusive, and all laws thereunto enabling. The ballots on the automatic voting machines shall show the nature of the proposals to be voted upon, and the ballot labels for the machine shall contain a condensed statement in not more than twenty words of said proposals accompanied by the words "Yes" and "No." The voting machines used at said election shall carry ballot labels which shall be the submission clauses, and said ballot labels shall be printed on white paper and on colored paper, as hereinafter provided, and shall be in substantially the following form:

Section 4. That if it is impracticable to supply each election precinct with a voting machine, there will be supplied as many such machines as it is practicable to procure, and the Board of County Commissioners will specify in which election districts or precincts within the County the machines will be used. The paper ballots to be used at said election in precincts not using voting machines, if any, will be prepared and furnished by the County Clerk to the officers of election, to be by them furnished to the electors. Said ballots shall be printed on white paper and on colored paper, as hereinafter provided, and shall be in substantially the following form:

Section 5. That the polls will be opened on the day of said election at the hour of 8:00 o'clock a.m. and will remain open and be closed at the hour of 6:00 o'clock p.m.

Section 6. That except as herein specifically provided, or except as provided in NRS 350.010 to 350.070, both inclusive, and all laws amendatory thereof, said election and the registration therefor shall be had and conducted in accordance with the general election laws of the State of Nevada, including but not limited to NRS 296.010 to 296.435, both inclusive, NRS 303.010 to 303.540, both inclusive, and all laws amendatory thereof and supplemental thereto.

Section 7. That at such election only duly qualified electors of Washoe County, Nevada, properly registered shall be entitled to vote.

Section 8. That the County Clerk of Washoe County and the Justices of the Peace resident in Washoe County, except those located in Reno, and any Deputy Registrars appointed are hereby authorized and directed immediately to prepare proper registry lists and records and to open their offices for the registration of electors, register all properly qualified electors, keep and maintain the registry lists and records, and otherwise perform the duties of registrars imposed upon them by law, not only for said primary election but also for said special bond election to be held at the same time as the primary election.

Section 9. That there shall be registration for said election which shall be conducted pursuant to, and shall conform as nearly as possible with, the requirements of the general laws of the State of Nevada governing the registration of persons for general elections. The County Clerk of Washoe County is hereby authorized and directed to conduct said registration pursuant to and in full conformity with said general laws. Any qualified elector whose name does not appear on the official registry list of qualified voters for the precinct in which he resides in said County as shown by the official records of the registry agent may apply to the County Clerk of Washoe County, at the office of the County Clerk in the County Court House in Reno, Nevada, or at the registration office of the Deputy Registrar designated

for said precinct, not later than thirty-one days (including Sundays and legal holidays) prior to the date of the election, i.e., on or before Saturday, the 2nd day of August, 1958, to have his name registered. Such registration offices shall be open regularly for the registration of voters up to, but not including, the thirtieth day next preceding such election between the regular hours of 9:00 o'clock a. m. to 12:00 o'clock noon and between 1:00 o'clock p.m. to 5:00 o'clock p.m. week days, with Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excepted; provided, that during the five days previous to the closing of registration before such election, i.e., commencing on Monday, the 28th day of July, 1958, the registration offices shall be open from 9:00 o'clock a.m. to 5:00 o'clock p.m. and from 7:00 o'clock p.m. to 9:00 o'clock p.m. including Saturday, with Sundays and legal holidays excepted. The County Clerk shall close all registration for a full period of thirty days prior to the date of the election, i.e., commencing with and including Sunday, the 3rd day of August, 1958, and within five days after the closing of registration the County Clerk shall submit to the Secretary of State a statement showing the number of voters registered for said election, approximating the number of registry cards not yet received at his office. The County Clerk shall cause to be published once each week for four consecutive weeks by at least five weekly insertions, the first publication to be not later than Tuesday, the 1st day of July, 1958, and the last not earlier than Monday, the 28th day of July, 1958, in at least one newspaper published in said County and having a general circulation therein, a notice signed by him to the effect that registration will be closed on the day provided by law, specifying such day and such notice, and stating that electors may register for the ensuing election by appearing before the County Clerk at his office, or by appearing before a Deputy Registrar in the manner provided by law. Such notice shall state that registration for the primary election to be held on Tuesday, September 2, 1958, shall constitute registration for the bond election to be held at the same time. At least fifteen days before the time when the register is closed for said primary election, i.e., not later than Friday, the 18th day of July, 1958, the County Clerk shall cause to be posted in not less than five conspicuous places in each voting precinct a copy of such notice stating the time when said official register shall close for said election; provided, however, that no posting shall be required in any incorporated city in which there is published any newspaper in which such publication of said notice is made as aforesaid.

The County Clerk shall also cause to be printed, typewritten or duplicated lists of all registered voters in the County segregated by precincts with party affiliation or non-partisan, the names in alphabetical order with surnames first (addresses may be included). The County Clerk shall, in addition, post or cause to be posted by the Deputy Registrar, not less than eight days before the election, i.e., on or before Monday, the 25th day of August, 1958, at least one list of the registered voters in one or more conspicuous place or places in each precinct, outside of incorporated towns, and shall cause to be published, by at least one insertion not more than ten days nor less than two days preceding said election, i.e., not before Saturday, the 23rd day of August, 1958, and not after Sunday, the 31st day of August, 1958, in the RENO EVENING GAZETTE, a newspaper published and of general circulation in the County of Washoe, a complete list of the registered electors of the County of Washoe segregated by precincts within said County. The County Clerk shall, in addition, do everything necessary to carry out registration in accordance with law.

Section 10. That said County Clerk is hereby directed to procure any and all necessary materials, equipment and supplies required by the general election laws or by NRS 350.010 to 350.070, both inclusive, as amended and supplemented, for the purpose of said election. It is hereby made the duty of the County Clerk to have made and to secure ballots in accordance herewith and upon this ordinance taking effect. The County Clerk shall also procure sufficient printed copies of the proposals set forth in Section 2 of this Ordinance to supply copies to the election officials, and to otherwise comply with the provisions of law.

Section 11. That at those polling places not furnished with voting machines, if any, the County Clerk shall provide one ballot box for each proposal for the purpose of such election at each polling place, and shall provide for the use of the electors entitled to vote at said election two sets of ballots for each proposal, one of which sets for each proposal shall be printed on white paper and the other on colored paper, which shall contain the same statement of the proposal to be voted upon and the same instruction of marking the ballots. Every citizen of the United States twenty-one years of age or more, who has resided in the State six months and in Washoe County thirty days next preceding such election, and who has complied with the registration laws of the State, shall be entitled to vote at said election. If such elector is not the owner of, or the spouse of the owner of, real property assessed on the assessment roll of the County of Washoe, he shall be furnished by the officers conducting such election with a ballot printed on white paper or he shall be permitted to vote upon a ballot label printed on white paper on a voting machine. If the said elector is the owner of, or the spouse of the owner of, real property assessed on the assessment roll of the County of Washoe, he shall, after making the requisite affidavit, be furnished by said officers with a ballot printed on colored paper, or he shall be permitted to vote upon a ballot label printed on colored paper on a voting machine. The automatic voting machines shall be so arranged that a separate tally will be maintained of the votes cast on each of said questions submitted by a ballot label printed on white paper and of the votes cast on each of said questions submitted by a ballot printed on colored paper. The counters for each label on the voting machines shall be locked off and be separate from all other counters on said machines. Before any person shall be permitted to vote a ballot printed on colored paper or a ballot label printed on colored paper, he shall be required to make before the officers of election who are authorized to take the same an affidavit showing that he is the owner of, or the spouse of the owner of, real property assessed on the assessment roll of Washoe County substantially in the following form:

Inspector of Election

Section 12. That at least fifteen days preceding said election, i.e., on or before Monday, the 18th day of August, 1958, the Board of County Commissioners of Washoe County shall appoint suitable persons who are citizens and qualified voters in Washoe County, Nevada, and in the precinct wherein they are to serve, at least three such persons to act as inspectors in each precinct and two such persons therein to act as clerks of the election. Such additional inspectors and clerks of election may be employed as may be necessary for the primary election as a result of the submission at such election of the two bond proposals. Said inspectors and clerks shall have charge of the ballots on the date of said election. They shall perform such duties in holding said election and make due return thereof as are required by the general election laws of the State of Nevada insofar as the same are not inconsistent with NRS 303.010

to 303.540 and NRS 350.010 to 350.200, both inclusive. The polling places, the voting precincts and the boundaries thereof shall be those designated for the general election held in the County on Tuesday, the 6th day of November, 1956, as thereafter changed and altered to comply with law.

Section 13. That immediately after the closing of the polls, the election officers shall proceed to canvass the votes cast on ballot labels printed on white paper on voting machines or on white paper ballots in the ballot box provided, or both, for each bond proposal; and at the conclusion of such canvass, the colored ballot labels on said machines or the colored paper ballots in the ballot box, or both, for each bond proposal. Separate and distinct records shall be made of the canvass of the white and colored ballots, and the results disclosed thereby shall be certified by the election officers to said Board of County Commissioners. In the event a majority of the white ballots and of the colored ballots is in favor of the issuance of the bonds, the proposal to issue said bonds shall have carried and the Board of County Commissioners shall proceed at its next regular meeting, or at some subsequent time, to adopt an ordinance providing for the issuance of said bonds. If a majority of either the white ballots or of the colored ballots on said questions is against the issuance of the bonds referred to in the proposal, then the proposal shall have failed and the election officers shall certify the result of said election to the Board of County Commissioners, which shall proceed no further in connection with the proposal which shall have failed.

Section 14. That the County Clerk be, and he hereby is, authorized and directed to publish notice of said bond election in full in the RENO EVENING GAZETTE, a newspaper published in Washoe County and of general circulation therein, at least once a week for four consecutive weeks prior to the date of said election by five insertions of said notice at weekly intervals, commencing on or before Monday, the 4th day of August, 1958, and ending on or before Monday, the 1st day of September 1958. That the County Clerk be, and he hereby is, also authorized and directed to have said notice posted at least fifteen days prior to said election, i.e., on or before Saturday, the 16th day of August, 1958, at the polling place at each precinct in said County, which notice shall be in substantially the following form:
