Notice is hereby given that Bill No. 381, amending Ordinance No. 120, entitled "An Ordinance to require yearly examination of food handlers; statement of public policy; definition; food handler's cards; expiration dates and fees; requirements; physical and medical examinations; prohibiting employment and appeals; penalties; and other matters relating thereto", was adopted on June 5, 1974, by Commissioners Rusk, Nelson, Pagni, Scott and Crow all voting aye.

SUMMARY: Amends County Ordinance No. 120 to require biennial physical examinations of food handlers and increases fees paid for food handler's cards.

BILL NO. 381

ORDINANCE NO. 120

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE TITLE OF AND AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE TO REQUIRE YEARLY EXAMINATION OF FOOD HANDLERS; STATEMENT OF PUBLIC POLICY; DEFINITIONS; FOOD HANDLER'S CARDS; EXPIRATION DATES AND FEES; REQUIREMENTS; PHYSICAL AND MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS; PROHIBITING EMPLOYMENT AND APPEALS; PENALTIES; AND OTHER MATTERS RELATING THERETO."

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF WASHOE COUNTY DO ORDAIN:

Section 1. Section 1 of Ordinance No. 120 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 1. It is hereby found and declared that the protection of the health, safety, and welfare of the inhabitants of the County of Washoe require the control and regulation of all persons engaged as food handlers and, pursuant to the General Welfare and to NRS 244.369, that the control of food handlers by the enactment of this ordinance is required.

Sec. 2. Section 4 of Ordinance No. 120 is hereby amended to read as follows:

Section 4. EXPIRATION DATE AND FEE

- A. All food handler's cards issued prior to the effective date of this amendatory ordinance shall expire one (1) year from the date of issuance. All food handler's cards issued on and after the effective date of this amendatory ordinance shall expire two (2) years from the date of issuance.
- B. On and after the effective date of this ordinance, a fee of four dollars (\$4.00) shall be charged for each card issued except in cases of student food handlers employed upon school premises in which case no fee shall be charged.

Sec. 3. The title of Ordinance No. 120 is hereby amended to read as follows:


AN ORDINANCE REQUIRING BIENNIAL EXAMINATIONS OF FOOD HANDLERS; DECLARING PUBLIC POLICY; DEFINING TERMS; REQUIRING FOOD HANDLER'S CARDS; SPECIFYING EXPIRATION DATES AND FEES; PROVIDING FOR PHYSICAL AND MEDICAL EXAMINATIONS; PROHIBITING EMPLOYMENT UNDER CERTAIN CIRCUMSTANCES; PROVIDING FOR APPEALS; PROVIDING PENALTIES; AND PROVIDING OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO.
