SUMMARY: Amends the Washoe County Code by reducing the minimum age of private policemen and security officers from 21 years to 18 years.

BILL NO. 822

ORDINANCE NO. <u>49</u>

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE WASHOE COUNTY CODE BY REDUCING THE MINIMUM AGE OF PRIVATE POLICEMEN AND SECURITY OFFICERS FROM 21 YEARS TO 18 YEARS.

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Section 25.325 of the Washoe County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

25.325 Policy; waiver.

- 1. It is hereby declared to be the policy of sections 25.323 to 25.351, inclusive, that all persons engaged in the business of protection of property or of maintaining peace and order shall be licensed and controlled so as to better protect the public safety and welfare of the inhabitants of the county, and the sheriff shall investigate the qualifications of each employee of such business. Before any prospective employee is employed, the sheriff shall determine that the prospective employee is suitable.
- To better define the policy of sections 25.323 to 25.351, inclusive, the following persons are declared not to be qualified or suitable to be employed as private policemen or security officers:
 - (a) A person who has been convicted of:
- A felony or other crime which under the laws of this state would amount to a felony.
- (2) Any crime of which fraud or intent to defraud was any element whether committed in this state or elsewhere.
 - Larceny in any degree.
 - (4) Buying or receiving stolen property.(5) Unlawful entry of a building.
- (6) Unlawful possession, use or distribution of controlled substances or dangerous drugs.
- (7) Illegal use, carrying, possession or display of a pistol or other dangerous weapon.
 - (b) A person under the age of 18 years.
- (c) A person who does not possess a good moral character.
- A person who has been convicted of more than one offense involving the operating of a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or controlled substances or dangerous drugs, if his duties may be expected to involve the operating of a motor vehicle.

(e) A person whose driving record reflects traffic convictions indicating poor driving habits, if his duties may be expected to involve the operating of a motor vehicle.

(f) A person who does not hold a currently valid Nevada

operator's or chauffeur's license.

(g) A person who is not a resident of the State of Nevada.

(h) A person whom the sheriff determines is not a suitable person, having due consideration for the proper protection of the public health, safety, morals, good order and general welfare of the inhabitants of the county.

3. If the applicant for a private policeman or security officer employment certificate has been convicted of any crime as described in subparagraphs (1) to (7), inclusive, of paragraph (a) of subsection 2 which would prohibit such employment and such conviction occurred more than 5 years before the date of such application, the sheriff may waive such prohibition and approve the issuance of an employment certificate.
