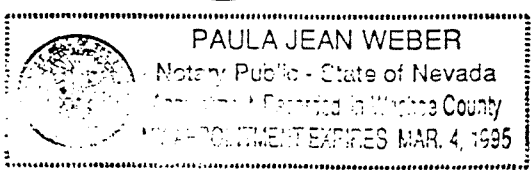

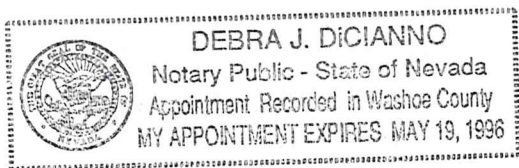

(1) **WHEREAS**, Washoe County, in the State of Nevada (the "County" and "State," respectively), is a county organized and operating under the laws of the State; and

(2) **WHEREAS**, the County has heretofore issued its General Obligation (Limited Tax) Various Purpose Bonds, Series March 1, 1992A (the "1992A Bonds") and its Installment Purchase Agreement Certificates of Participation, Series 1987 (the "1987 Bonds"); and

(4) **WHEREAS**, pursuant to NRS §§ 354.430 through 354.460 and § 354.618 (the "Note Act"), the County is authorized to enter into short-term financing to finance the Project and to issue, as evidence thereof, negotiable short-term notes or bonds payable from annual general (ad valorem) taxes ("General Taxes") (subject to certain Constitutional and statutory tax limitations), which must mature not later than 10 years after the date of issuance and must bear interest at a rate or rates which do not exceed by more than 3 percent the "Index of Twenty Bonds" which was most recently published before bids for their purchase are received; and

(5) **WHEREAS**, the County has received the approval of the General Obligation Bond Commission of Washoe County pursuant to NRS §§ 350.001 to 350.006, inclusive (the "GOBC Act"); and

(6) **WHEREAS**, pursuant to NRS § 354.618 and pursuant to a resolution adopted by the Board, the Board determined to publish a notice (the "Notice") of its intention to authorize and to issue short-term bonds in the maximum principal amount of \$10,700,000 and of a public hearing to be held on the matter on March 22, 1994 (the "Hearing") in a newspaper of general circulation in the County at least 10 days prior the Hearing, and an affidavit of such publication is on file in the office of the County Clerk; and

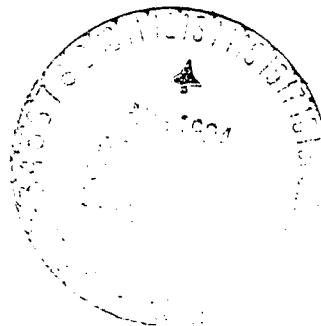

(10) **WHEREAS**, the approval of the Department of Taxation as set forth in the preambles hereof is hereby spread upon the minutes of the Board as required by § 354.430; and

(11) **WHEREAS**, the County has not previously utilized any of the authority so approved by the Department of Taxation; and

(12) **WHEREAS**, the Board by a resolution adopted on March 22, 1994, ordered the short-term financing to be publicly offered for sale in the form of short-term bonds, authorized the distribution of an Official Notice of Bond Sale; and

(13) **WHEREAS**, the Board hereby determines that the Bonds herein authorized to be issued shall be designated the "Washoe County, Nevada, General Obligation (Limited Tax) Court Complex and Refunding Bonds, Series May 1, 1994" in the aggregate principal amount set forth in Section 6 hereof (the "Bonds"); and

(14) **WHEREAS**, the Board has determined and hereby declares and determines that legally available funds of the County will at least equal the amount required in each year for the payment of interest on and the principal of the Bonds; and

(15) **WHEREAS**, the Board has heretofore elected to and hereby determines to issue the Bonds in accordance with the provisions of NRS §§ 350.500 through 350.720, and all laws amendatory thereof, designated in § 350.500 thereof by the short title "Local Government Securities Law" (the "Bond Act"); and

(16) **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the Bond Act the County is authorized to refund its outstanding bonds for the purpose of reducing interest rates or effecting other economies; and

(17) **WHEREAS**, in order to reduce interest rates or effect other economies, the Board hereby determines to refund a portion of its outstanding 1992A Bonds maturing on January 1, 1994 through 1997 (the "1992A Refunded Bonds") and its outstanding 1987 Bonds (collectively the "Refunded Bonds"); and

(18) **WHEREAS**, the Board is not authorized to levy General Taxes to pay the principal of or interest on the Bonds exempt from the limitations of any statutes of the State; any General Taxes levied for the purpose of paying principal or interest on the Bonds will be subject to the limitations contained in the Constitution and the statutes of the State, including, without

limitation, the limitations on ad valorem taxes contained in NRS §§ 354.59811, 354.59813, 354.59815, 354.5982, and 361.453; and

(19) **WHEREAS**, the Board is therefore authorized and empowered by the Project Act, by the Note Act, the GOBC Act, by the approval of the Executive Director of the Department of Taxation, and by the Bond Act, without any further preliminaries:

A. To issue and sell the County's Bonds; and

B. To exercise the incidental powers provided in the Bond Act in connection with the powers authorized therein or as otherwise expressly provided therein; and

(20) **WHEREAS**, after public advertisement the Board caused to be received and to be opened publicly on Monday, February 24, 1994, sealed bids for the purchase of all of the Bonds herein authorized; and

(21) **WHEREAS**, the best bid was submitted by Dean Witter Reynolds, Inc. (the "Purchaser"), which bid offered to purchase the Bonds bearing interest and upon the other terms provided below, for a purchase price consisting of their principal amount, plus accrued interest from the date of the Bonds to the date of their delivery, less a discount of \$109,917.00 (the "Purchase Proposal"); and

(22) **WHEREAS**, the Board hereby determines and declares that it is necessary and for the best interests of the County and its inhabitants to acquire the Project and to issue and sell the Bonds to defray wholly or in part the cost of the Project; and

(23) **WHEREAS**, the effective interest rate on the Bonds herein authorized does not exceed by more than 3% the "Index of Twenty Bonds" which was most recently published in The Bond Buyer before bids for the Bonds were received (i.e., published on Friday, April 15, 1994); and

(24) **WHEREAS**, the Board hereby elects to have the provisions of Chapter 348 of NRS (the "Supplemental Bond Act") apply to the Bonds; and

(25) **WHEREAS**, the Board has determined and hereby declares that each of the limitations and other conditions to the issuance of the Bonds in the Project Act, the GOBC Act, the Note Act, the Bond Act, the Supplemental Bond Act, and in any other relevant act of the State or

the Federal Government, has been met; and pursuant to § 350.708, Bond Act, this determination of the Board that the limitations in the Bond Act have been met shall be conclusive in the absence of fraud or arbitrary or gross abuse of discretion.

(26) **WHEREAS**, the Board has determined and does hereby declare:

(i) This Ordinance pertains to the sale, issuance and payment of the Bonds; and

(ii) Such declaration shall be conclusive in the absence of fraud or gross abuse of discretion in accordance with the provisions of subsection 2, § 350.579, Bond Act; and

(iii) This Ordinance may accordingly be adopted as if an emergency exists and may become effective at any time when an emergency ordinance of the County may go into effect.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE, IN THE STATE OF NEVADA, DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. **Short Title.** This Ordinance shall be known and may be cited as the "1994 Court Complex and Refunding Bond Ordinance."

SECTION 2. **Acceptance of Purchase Proposal.** The Purchase Proposal submitted by the Purchaser for the purchase of the Bonds as set forth in the preambles hereof is hereby formally approved and accepted.

SECTION 3. **Ratification.** All action heretofore taken by the Board and the officers and employees of the County directed toward the Project and toward the issuance, sale and delivery of the Bonds is ratified, approved and confirmed including, without limitation, any and all revisions to the Official Notice of Bond Sale, and the distribution of the official statement for the Bonds.

SECTION 4. **Necessity of Project and Bonds.** It is necessary and in the best interests of the Board, its officers, and the inhabitants of the County, that the County effect the Project and defray wholly or in part the cost thereof by the issuance of the Bonds therefor; and it is hereby so determined and declared.

SECTION 5. **Authorization of Project.** The Board hereby authorizes the Project.

SECTION 6. **Authorization of Bonds.** For the purpose of providing funds to pay all or a portion of the cost of the Project, the County shall issue the "Washoe County, Nevada, General Obligation (Limited Tax) Court Complex and Refunding Bonds, Series May 1, 1994" in the aggregate principal amount of \$7,965,000. The Bonds shall be in the form substantially as set forth in Section 24 hereof.

SECTION 7. **Ordinance to Constitute Contract.** In consideration of the purchase and the acceptance of the Bonds by those who shall own the same from time to time, the provisions hereof shall be deemed to be and shall constitute a contract between the County and the registered owners from time to time of the Bonds.

SECTION 8. **Bonds Equally Secured.** The covenants and agreements herein set forth to be performed shall be for the equal benefit, protection and security of the owners of any and all of the outstanding Bonds, all of which, regardless of the time or times of their maturity, shall be of equal rank without preference, priority or distinction except as otherwise expressly provided in or pursuant to this Ordinance.

SECTION 9. **General Obligations.** All of the Bonds, as to the principal thereof and the interest thereon (the "Bond Requirements") shall constitute general obligations of the County, which hereby pledges its full faith and credit for their payment.

SECTION 10. **Payment of the Bonds.** The Bond Requirements of the Bonds shall be payable from any monies legally available therefor, and provision for the payment of the Bond Requirements of the Bonds shall be made as provided in §§ 354.450 and 354.460, Note Act, provided, however, that ad valorem taxes levied for the purpose of paying the principal of or interest on the Bonds shall be subject to the limitations contained in the Constitution and statutes of the State, including, without limitation, the limitations on the levy of ad valorem taxes imposed by NRS §§ 354.59811, 354.59813, 354.59815, 354.5982 and 361.453. The County is not authorized to levy ad valorem taxes exempt from the limitations of any of said statutes to pay the Bond Requirements of the Bonds. The County hereby irrevocably covenants with the registered owners of the Bonds from time to time that it will make sufficient provisions annually in its budget to pay the Bond Requirements of the Bonds, when due.

SECTION 11. **Limitations upon Security.** The payment of the Bonds is not secured by an encumbrance, mortgage or other pledge of property of the County, except for the proceeds of General Taxes and any other moneys pledged for the payment of the Bonds. No property of the County, subject to such exception, shall be liable to be forfeited or taken in payment of the Bonds.

SECTION 12. **No Recourse Against Officers and Agents.** No recourse shall be had for the payment of the Bond Requirements of the Bonds or for any claim based thereon or otherwise upon this Ordinance authorizing their issuance or any other instrument relating thereto, against any individual member of the Board or any officer or other agent of the Board or County, past, present or future, either directly or indirectly through the Board or the County, or otherwise, whether by virtue of any constitution, statute or rule of law, or by the enforcement of any penalty or otherwise, all such liability, if any, being by the acceptance of the Bond and as a part of the consideration of its issuance specially waived and released.

SECTION 13. **Bond Details.** Except as otherwise provided in Section 17 hereof, the Bonds shall be issued in fully registered form. The Bonds shall be dated as of May 1, 1994, and shall be issued in denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof (provided that no Bond may be in a denomination which exceeds the principal coming due on any maturity date, and no individual Bond will be issued with more than one maturity). The Bonds shall bear interest from their date until their respective maturity dates at the respective rates set forth below, payable on November 1 and May 1 of each year commencing on November 1, 1994; provided that those Bonds which are reissued upon transfer, exchange or other replacement shall bear interest at the rates shown below from the most recent interest payment date to which interest has been paid or duly provided for, or if no interest has been paid, from the date of the Bond. The Bonds shall mature serially on May 1 in the designated amounts of principal and years as follows:

The principal of any Bond shall be payable to the owner thereof as shown on the registration books kept by Bank of America Nevada, in Las Vegas, Nevada, as registrar for the Bonds (the "Registrar"), upon maturity and upon presentation and surrender at the office of Bank of America Nevada, in Las Vegas, Nevada, as paying agent for the Bonds (the "Paying Agent") or such other office as designated by the Paying Agent. If any Bond shall not be paid upon such presentation and surrender at or after maturity, it shall continue to draw interest at the interest rate borne by said Bond until the principal thereof is paid in full. Except as otherwise provided in Section 17 hereof, payment of interest on any Bond shall be made to the owner thereof by check or draft mailed by the Paying Agent, on or before each interest payment date (or, if such interest payment date is not a business day, on or before the next succeeding business day), to the owner thereof, at his or her address as shown on the registration records kept by the Registrar as of the close of business on the 15th day of the calendar month next preceding each interest payment date (other than a special interest payment date hereafter fixed for payment of defaulted interest) (the "Regular Record Date"); but any such interest not so timely paid or duly provided for shall cease to be payable to the owner thereof as shown on the registration records of the Registrar as of the close of business on the Regular Record Date and shall be payable to the owner thereof, at his or her address, as shown on the registration records of the Registrar as of the close of business on a date fixed to determine the names and addresses of owners for the purpose of paying defaulted interest (the "Special Record Date"). Such Special Record Date shall

be fixed by the Registrar whenever moneys become available for payment of the defaulted interest, and notice of the Special Record Date shall be given to the owners of the Bonds not less than ten days prior thereto by first-class mail to each such owner as shown on the Registrar's registration records as of a date selected by the Registrar, stating the date of the Special Record Date and the date fixed for the payment of such defaulted interest. The Paying Agent may make payments of interest on any Bond by such alternative means as may be mutually agreed to between the owner of such Bond and the Paying Agent. All such payments shall be made in lawful money of the United States of America without deduction for any service charges of the Paying Agent or Registrar.

SECTION 14. Optional Redemption; Mandatory Redemption; Partial Redemption; Notice of Redemption.

A. Optional Redemption. The Bonds, or portions thereof (\$5,000 or any integral multiple), maturing on and after May 1, 2000 shall be subject to optional redemption prior to their respective maturities, on and after May 1, 1999, at the option of the County, in whole or in part at any time, from any maturities selected by the County, by lot within a maturity (giving proportionate weight to Bonds in denominations larger than \$5,000), at a price equal to the principal amount of each Bond, or portion thereof, so redeemed, accrued interest thereon to the redemption date, and a premium computed in accordance with the following schedule:

1.00% of the principal amount so redeemed if redeemed on or before April 30, 2000, and

No premium if redeemed thereafter.

B. Mandatory Redemption. The Bonds are subject to mandatory sinking fund redemption if so provided in the attached Exhibit I, which is an integral part of this Ordinance.

C. Partial Redemption. If any Bond is in a denomination larger than \$5,000, a portion of such Bond (\$5,000 or any integral thereof) may be redeemed in which case the Registrar, except as provided in § 17 hereof, shall without charge to the registered owner of such Bond, authenticate and issue a replacement Bond or Bonds for the unredeemed portion thereof.

D. Redemption Notice. Unless waived by any registered owner of a Bond to be redeemed, official notice of any such redemption shall be given by the Registrar on behalf of and on

the direction of the County (which direction shall be given by the County to the Registrar and Paying Agent in writing not less than 60 days prior to the redemption date), by mailing a copy of an official notice of redemption, as long as a nominee of The Depository Trust Company or a successor depository is the registered owner of the Bonds by registered or certified mail, and otherwise by first class mail, at least 30 days and not more than 60 days prior to the date fixed for redemption to the registered owner of the Bond or Bonds to be redeemed at the address shown on the records of the Registrar. Failure to give such notice to the registered owner of any Bond, or any defect therein, shall not affect the validity of the proceedings for the redemption of any other Bonds.

All official notices of redemption shall be dated and shall state:

1. The redemption date,
2. The redemption prices,
3. If less than all outstanding Bonds are to be redeemed, the identification (and, in the case of partial redemption, the respective principal amounts) of the Bonds to be redeemed,
4. That on the redemption date the redemption price will become due and payable upon each such Bond or portion thereof called for redemption, and that interest thereon shall cease to accrue from and after said date, and
5. The place where such Bonds are to be surrendered for payment of the redemption price, which place of payment shall be the principal office of the Paying Agent or such other office as may be designated by the Paying Agent. Official notice of redemption having been given as aforesaid, the Bonds or portions of Bonds so to be redeemed shall, on the redemption date, become due and payable at the redemption price therein specified, and from and after such date (unless the County shall default in the payment of the redemption price) such Bonds or portions of Bonds shall cease to bear or accrue interest. Upon surrender of such Bonds for redemption in accordance with said notice, such Bonds shall be paid by the Paying Agent at the redemption price. Installments of interest due prior to the redemption date and, if the redemption date is an interest payment date, on the redemption date shall be payable

as herein provided for payments of interest. Accrued interest due on any Bond which is called for prior redemption on a date which is not an interest payment date will be paid at the time the principal of such Bond is paid. Except as provided in § 17 hereof, upon surrender for any partial redemption of any Bond, there shall be prepared for the registered owner a new Bond or Bonds of the same maturity and of the same series in the amount of the unpaid principal. All Bonds which have been redeemed shall be canceled and destroyed by the Registrar and shall not be reissued. A certificate by the Registrar that notice of redemption has been given as provided in this section shall be conclusive as against all parties; and no owner whose Bond is called for redemption or any other holder of any bond or any other person may object thereto or may object to the cessation of interest on the redemption date on the ground that he failed actually to receive or see such notice of call and redemption.

SECTION 15. **Negotiability**. Subject to the registration provisions herein provided, the Bonds shall be fully negotiable within the meaning of and for the purpose of the Uniform Commercial Code - Investment Securities and each owner shall possess all rights enjoyed by holders of negotiable instruments under the Uniform Commercial Code - Investment Securities.

SECTION 16. **Registration, Transfer and Exchange of Bonds**. Except as otherwise provided in Section 17 hereof:

A. Records for the registration and transfer of the Bonds shall be kept by the Registrar. Upon the surrender of any Bond at the Registrar, duly endorsed for transfer or accompanied by an assignment in form satisfactory to the Registrar duly executed by the owner or his or her attorney duly authorized in writing, the Registrar shall authenticate and deliver in the name of the transferee or transferees a new Bond or Bonds of a like aggregate principal amount and of the same maturity, bearing a number or numbers not previously assigned. Bonds may be exchanged at the Registrar for an equal aggregate principal amount of Bonds of the same maturity of other authorized denominations, as provided in § 13 hereof. The Registrar shall authenticate and deliver a Bond or Bonds which the owner making the exchange is entitled to receive, bearing a number or numbers not previously assigned. For every exchange or transfer of Bonds requested by the owner

thereof, the Registrar may make a sufficient charge to reimburse it for any tax, fee or other governmental charge required to be paid with respect to such exchange or transfer and may charge a sum sufficient to pay the cost of preparing and authenticating a new Bond.

B. The person in whose name any Bond shall be registered, on the registration records kept by the Registrar, shall be deemed and regarded as the absolute owner thereof for the purpose of payment and for all other purposes (except to the extent otherwise provided in § 13 hereof with respect to interest payments); and payment of or on account of either principal or interest on any Bond shall be made only to or upon the written order of the owner thereof or his or her legal representative. All such payments shall be valid and effectual to discharge the liability upon such Bond to the extent of the sum or sums so paid.

C. If any Bond shall be lost, stolen, destroyed or mutilated, the Registrar shall, upon receipt of such evidence, information or indemnity relating thereto as it or the County may reasonably require, and upon payment of all expenses in connection therewith, authenticate and deliver a replacement Bond or Bonds of a like aggregate principal amount and of the same maturity, bearing a number or numbers not previously assigned. If such lost, stolen, destroyed or mutilated Bond shall have matured, the Registrar may direct that such Bond be paid by the Paying Agent in lieu of replacement.

D. Whenever any Bond shall be surrendered to the Paying Agent upon payment thereof, or to the Registrar for transfer, exchange or replacement as provided herein, such Bond shall be promptly canceled by the Paying Agent or Registrar, and counterparts of a certificate of such cancellation shall be furnished by the Paying Agent or Registrar to the Board, upon request.

SECTION 17. **Book Entry.**

A. Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of Sections 13 to 16 hereof, the Bonds shall initially be evidenced by one Bond for each year in which the Bonds mature in denominations equal to the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds maturing in that year. Such initially delivered Bonds shall be registered in the name of "Cede & Co." as nominee for The Depository Trust Company, the securities depository for the Bonds. The bonds may not thereafter be transferred or exchanged except:

(1) to any successor of The Depository Trust Company or its nominee, which successor must be both a "clearing corporation" as defined in subsection 3 of NRS § 104.8102, and a qualified and registered "clearing agency" under Section 17A of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended; or

(2) upon the resignation of The Depository Trust Company or a successor or new depository under clause (1) or this clause (2) of this Subsection A, or a determination by the Board that The Depository Trust Company or such successor or new depository is no longer able to carry out its functions, and the designation by the Board of another depository institution acceptable to the Board and to the depository then holding the bonds, which new depository institution must be both a "clearing corporation" as defined in subsection 3 of NRS § 104.8102 and a qualified and registered "clearing agency" under Section 17A of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended, to carry out the functions of The Depository Trust Company or such successor or new depository; or

(3) upon the resignation of The Depository Trust Company or a successor or new depository under clause (1) or clause (2) of this Subsection A, or a determination of the Board that The Depository Trust Company or such successor or new depository is no longer able to carry out its functions, and the failure by the Board, after reasonable investigation, to locate another qualified depository institution under clause (2) to carry out such depository functions.

B. In the case of a transfer to a successor of The Depository Trust Company or its nominee as referred to in clause (1) of Subsection A hereof or designation of a new depository pursuant to clause (2) of Subsection A hereof, upon receipt of the outstanding Bonds by the Registrar, together with written instructions for transfer satisfactory to the Registrar, a new Bond for

each maturity of the Bonds then outstanding shall be issued to such successor or new depository, as the case may be, or its nominee, as is specified in such written transfer instructions. In the case of a resignation or determination under clause (3) of Subsection A hereof and the failure after reasonable investigation to locate another qualified depository institution for the bonds as provided in clause (3) of Subsection A hereof, and upon receipt of the outstanding bonds by the Registrar, together with written instructions for transfer satisfactory to the Registrar, new Bonds shall be issued in the denominations of \$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof, as provided in any subject to the limitations of Section 13 hereof, registered in the names of such persons, and in such denominations as are requested in such written transfer instructions; however, the Registrar shall not be required to deliver such new Bonds within a period of less than 60 days from the date of receipt of such written transfer instructions.

C. The Board, the Registrar and the Paying Agent shall be entitled to treat the registered owner of any Bond as the absolute owner thereof for all purposes hereof and any applicable laws, notwithstanding any notice to the contrary received by any or all of them and the Board, the Registrar and the Paying Agent shall have no responsibility for transmitting payments to the beneficial owners of the Bonds held by The Depository Trust Company or any successor or new depository named pursuant to Subsection A hereof.

D. The Board, the Registrar and the Paying Agent shall endeavor to cooperate with The Depository Trust Company or any successor or new depository named pursuant to clause (1) or (2) of Subsection A hereof in effectuating payment of the Bond Requirements of the Bonds by arranging for payment in such a manner that funds representing such payments are available to the depository on the date they are due.

SECTION 18. **Execution and Authentication.**

A. Prior to the execution of any Bonds and pursuant to § 350.638, Bond Act, to the act known as the Uniform Facsimile Signatures of Public Officials Act, cited as Chapter 351, NRS, and to the Supplemental Bond Act, the Chairman of the Board (the "Chairman"), the County Treasurer (the "Treasurer") and the County Clerk (the "Clerk") shall have each filed with the Secretary of State of Nevada his or her manual signature certified by him or her under oath.

B. The Bonds shall be approved, signed and executed in the name of and on behalf of the County with the manual or facsimile signature of the Chairman, shall be signed and executed with the manual or facsimile signature of the Treasurer, and shall bear a manual impression or a facsimile of an impression of the official seal of the County attested with the manual or facsimile signature of the Clerk.

C. No Bond shall be valid or obligatory for any purpose unless the certificate of authentication thereon, substantially in the form hereinafter provided, has been duly manually executed by the Registrar. The Registrar's certificate of authentication shall be deemed to have been duly executed by it if manually signed by an authorized officer or employee of the Registrar, but it shall not be necessary that the same officer sign the certificate of authentication on all of the Bonds issued hereunder. By authenticating any of the Bonds initially delivered pursuant to this Ordinance, the Registrar shall be deemed to have assented to all of the provisions of this Ordinance.

D. The Chairman, the Treasurer and the Clerk are hereby authorized and directed to prepare and to execute the Bonds as herein provided.

SECTION 19. **Use of Predecessor's Signature.** The Bonds bearing the signatures of the officers in office at the time of the execution of the Bonds shall be valid and binding obligations of the County, notwithstanding that before their delivery any or all of the persons who executed them shall have ceased to fill their respective offices. The Chairman, the Treasurer, and the Clerk at the time of the execution of a signature certificate relating to the Bonds, may each adopt as and for his own facsimile signature the facsimile signature of his predecessor in office if such facsimile signature appears upon any of the Bonds.

SECTION 20. **Incontestable Recital.** Pursuant to § 350.628 of the Bond Act, the Bonds shall contain a recital that they are issued pursuant to the Bond Act, which recital shall be conclusive evidence of the validity of the Bonds and the regularity of their issuance.

SECTION 21. **State Tax Exemption.** Pursuant to § 350.710, Bond Act, the Bonds, their transfer and the income therefrom shall forever be and remain free and exempt from taxation by

the State or any subdivision thereof, except for the tax on estates imposed pursuant to Chapter 375A of NRS and the tax on generation-skipping transfers imposed pursuant to Chapter 375B of NRS.

SECTION 22. **Initial Registration.** The Registrar shall maintain the registration records of the County for the Bonds, showing the name and address of the owner of each Bond authenticated and delivered, the date of authentication, the maturity of the Bond, and its interest rate, principal amount, and Bond number.

SECTION 23. **Bond Delivery.** After such registration by the Registrar and after their execution and authentication as provided herein, the Treasurer shall cause the Bonds to be delivered to the Purchaser, upon payment being made in accordance with the terms of their sale.

SECTION 24. **Bond Form.** Subject to the provisions of this Ordinance, the Bonds shall be in substantially the following form, with such omissions, insertions, endorsements, and variations as may be required by the circumstances, be required or permitted by this Ordinance, or be consistent with this Ordinance and necessary or appropriate to conform to the rules and requirements of any governmental authority or any usage or requirement of law with respect thereto:

SECTION 25. Use of Bond Proceeds. Upon the issuance of the Bonds, the County Treasurer shall cause the proceeds of the Bonds to be applied as follows:

A. First, there shall be deposited into a special account hereby created and designated as the "Washoe County, Nevada, General Obligation (Limited Tax) Court Complex and Refunding Bonds, Series May 1, 1994, Escrow Account" (the "Escrow Account") to be held by Bank of America Nevada, Las Vegas, Nevada (the "Escrow Bank") an amount fully sufficient to establish, together with any other moneys therein (including the monies deposited therein from the reserve fund for the 1987 Bonds and any monies deposited therein from the debt service fund for the Refunded Bonds), any initial cash balance remaining uninvested and to buy the Federal Securities, hereinafter defined, designated in the Escrow Agreement for credit to the Escrow Account, to be used solely for the purpose of paying the Bond Requirements of the Refunded Bonds as provided in the agreement between the County and the Escrow Bank dated as of May 1, 1994 (the "Escrow Agreement").

B. Second, pursuant to § 350.648, Bond Act, the Bond proceeds received from the sale of the Bonds as accrued interest on the Bonds shall be deposited into the Short-Term Debt Service Fund, hereinafter created.

C. The balance of the proceeds received from the sale of the Bonds shall be deposited into a special account hereby created and designated as the "Washoe County, Nevada, General Obligation (Limited Tax) Court Complex and Refunding Bonds, Series May 1, 1994, Acquisition Account" (the "Acquisition Account") to be held by the County. Moneys in the Acquisition Account shall be used solely to defray wholly or in part the cost of the Improvement Project including, without limitation, as provided in § 350.516, Bond Act, all costs of issuing the Bonds, and the costs of rebates to the United States under § 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Tax Code"), which the Board hereby determines are necessary and desirable and pertain to the Improvement Project. After the Improvement Project is complete and after all expenses have been paid or adequate provision therefor is made, pursuant to § 350.650 Bond Act, any unexpended balance of Bond proceeds (or, unless otherwise required by law, any other moneys) remaining in the Acquisition Account shall be deposited into the Short-Term Debt Service Fund hereinafter created to be used to pay the principal of and interest on the Bonds.

SECTION 26. **Use of Investment Gain.** Pursuant to § 350.658, Bond Act, any gain from any investment and any reinvestment of any proceeds of the Bonds (except the Bond proceeds in the Escrow Account) shall be deposited promptly upon the receipt of such gain at any time or from time to time into the Acquisition Account to defray, in part, the cost of the Improvement Project or, if adequate provision has been made for the Improvement Project, into the Short-Term Debt Service Fund, hereinafter created, for the respective payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds or any combination thereof. As provided in § 34 hereof, any annual General Taxes for the payment of the principal of or interest on the Bonds levied after such deposits of any such investment or reinvestment gain, may be diminished to the extent of the availability of such deposit for the payment of such principal or interest.

SECTION 27. **Completion of Project.** The County, with the proceeds derived from the sale of the Bonds, shall proceed to complete the Project without delay and with due diligence to the best of the County's ability, as hereinabove provided. A contract or contracts for the construction and other acquisition of the Improvement Project shall be let as soon as practicable after the delivery of any Bonds except to the extent theretofore let, if theretofore let.

SECTION 28. **Prevention of Bond Default.** Subject to the provisions of §§ 30 and 34 hereof, the Treasurer shall use any Bond proceeds credited to the Acquisition Account, without further order or warrant, to pay the Bond Requirements of the Bonds as the same become due whenever and to the extent moneys otherwise available therefor are insufficient for that purpose, unless such Bond proceeds shall be needed to defray obligations accrued and to accrue under any contracts then existing and relating to the Project. The Treasurer shall promptly notify the Board of any such use.

SECTION 29. **Purchaser Not Responsible.** The validity of the Bonds shall not be dependent on nor be affected by the validity or regularity of any proceedings relating to the Project, or any part thereof, or to the completion of the Project. The Purchaser, any associate thereof, and any subsequent owner of any Bond shall in no manner be responsible for the application or disposal by the County or by any of its officers, agents and employees of the moneys derived from the sale of the Bonds or of any other moneys herein designated.

SECTION 30. **General Tax Levies.** Pursuant to § 350.596, Bond Act, if necessary, the interest falling due on the Bonds and the principal amount of Bonds maturing on May 1, 1995 shall be paid out of the Acquisition Account or out of a general fund of the County or out of any other funds that may be available for such purpose, including, without limitation, any proceeds of General Taxes legally available therefor. For the purpose of repaying any moneys so paid from any such fund or funds (other than any moneys available without replacement for the payment of such Bond Requirements on other than a temporary basis), and for the purpose of creating funds for the payment of the Bond Requirements, there is hereby created a separate account designated as the "Washoe County, Nevada, General Obligation (Limited Tax) Court Complex and Refunding Bonds, Series May 1, 1994, Short-Term Debt Service Fund" (the "Short-Term Debt Service Fund"). Pursuant to §§ 350.592 and 350.594, Bond Act, and § 354.460, Note Act, except to the extent other funds are legally available therefor, there shall be duly levied immediately after the issuance of the Bonds and annually thereafter, until all of the Bond Requirements shall have been fully paid, satisfied and discharged, a General Tax on all property, both real and personal, subject to taxation within the boundaries of the County, including the net proceeds of mines, fully sufficient to reimburse such fund or funds for any such amounts temporarily advanced to pay such initial installment of interest, and to pay the interest on the Bonds becoming due after such initial installment, and to pay and retire the Bonds as they thereafter become due at maturity as herein provided, after there are made due allowances for probable delinquencies. The proceeds of such annual levies shall be duly credited to the Short-Term Debt Service Fund for the payment of such Bond Requirements. In the preparation of the annual budget or appropriation resolution or ordinance for the County, the Board shall first make proper provisions through the levy of sufficient General Taxes for the payment of the interest on and the retirement of the principal of the bonded indebtedness of the County, including, without limitation, the Bonds, subject to the limitation imposed by NRS §§ 354.59811, 354.59813, 354.59815, 354.5982 and § 361.453 and Section 2, art. 10, State Constitution, and the amount of money necessary for this purpose shall be a first charge against all the revenues received by the County which are legally available to pay the Bond Requirements of the Bonds.

SECTION 31. **Priorities for Bonds.** The County hereby covenants that in any year in which the total General Taxes levied against the property in the County by all overlapping units within the boundaries of the County exceeds the limitations imposed by NRS § 361.453, 354.59811, 354.59813 and 354.5982 or a lesser or greater amount fixed by the State Board of Examiners in any fiscal year, and it becomes necessary by reason thereof to reduce the levies made by any and all such units, the reductions so made shall be in General Taxes levied by the County for purposes other than the payment of the Bond Requirements of the Bonds and other bonded indebtedness of the County including interest thereon. The General Taxes levied for the payment of the Bonds and such bonded indebtedness and the interest thereon shall always enjoy a priority over General Taxes levied by the County for all other purposes where reduction is necessary in order to comply with the limitation of NRS §§ 361.453, 354.59811, 354.59813 and 354.59 82.

SECTION 32. **Correlation of Levies.** Such General Taxes shall be levied and collected in the same manner and at the same time as other taxes are levied and collected, and the proceeds thereof for the Bonds herein authorized shall be kept in the Short-Term Debt Service Fund, which accounts shall be used for no other purpose than the payment of principal and interest, respectively, as the same fall due.

SECTION 33. **Use of General Fund.** Any sums becoming due on the Bonds at any time when there are on hand from such General Taxes (and any other legally available moneys) insufficient funds to pay the same shall be promptly paid when due from general funds on hand belonging to the County, reimbursement to be made for such general funds in the amounts so advanced when the General Taxes herein provided for have been collected, pursuant to § 350.596, Bond Act.

SECTION 34. **Use of Other Funds.** Nothing in this Ordinance prevents the County from applying any funds (other than General Taxes) that may be available for that purpose to the payment of the Bond Requirements as the same, respectively, mature, and upon such payments, the levy or levies herein provided may thereupon to that extent be diminished, pursuant to § 350.598, Bond Act.

SECTION 35. **Legislative Duties.** In accordance with § 350.592, Bond Act, it shall be the duty of the Board annually, at the time and in the manner provided by law for levying other General Taxes of the County, if such action shall be necessary to effectuate the provisions of this Ordinance, to ratify and carry out the provisions hereof with reference to the levy and collection of General Taxes; and the Board shall require the officers of the County to levy, extend and collect such General Taxes in the manner provided by law for the purpose of creating funds for the payment of the principal of the Bonds and the interest thereon. Such General Taxes, when collected shall be kept for and applied only to the payment of the principal of and the interest on the Bonds as hereinbefore specified.

SECTION 36. **Appropriation of General Taxes.** In accordance with § 350.602, Bond Act, there is hereby specially appropriated the proceeds of such General Taxes to the payment of such principal of and interest on the Bonds; and such appropriations will not repealed nor the General Taxes postponed or diminished (except as herein otherwise expressly provided) until the Bond Requirements the Bonds have been wholly paid or provided for.

SECTION 37. **Protective Covenants.** The County covenants and agrees with each and every owner from time to time of the Bonds, that:

- A. The Project shall be completed without delay; and
- B. The County will make the Bonds principal and interest payments at the place, on the date, and in the manner specified according to the true intent and meaning hereof.

SECTION 38. **Tax Covenant.** The County covenants for the benefit of the owners of the Bonds that it will not take any action or omit to take any action with respect to the Bonds, the proceeds thereof, any other funds of the County or any facilities financed with the proceeds of the Bonds or the Refunded Bonds if such action or omission (i) would cause the interest on the Bonds to lose its exclusion from gross income for federal income tax purposes under § 103 of the Tax Code, or (ii) would cause interest on the Bonds to lose its exclusion from alternative minimum taxable income as defined in § 55(b)(2) of the Tax Code except to the extent such interest is required to be included in the adjusted current earnings adjustment applicable to corporations under § 56 of the Tax

Code in calculating corporate alternative minimum taxable income. The foregoing covenant shall remain in full force and effect notwithstanding the payment in full or defeasance of the Bonds until the date on which all obligations of the County in fulfilling the above covenant under the Tax Code have been met.

SECTION 39. **Defeasance.** When all Bond Requirements of any Bond have been duly paid, the pledge, the lien, and all obligations hereunder shall thereby be discharged and that Bond shall no longer be deemed to be outstanding within the meaning of this Ordinance. There shall be deemed to be such due payment when the County has placed in escrow or in trust with a trust bank located within or without the State, an amount sufficient (including the known minimum yield available for such purpose from bills, certificates of indebtedness, notes, bonds or similar securities which are direct obligations of, or the principal of and interest on which are unconditionally guaranteed by the United States ("Federal Securities") in which such amount may be initially invested wholly or in part) to meet all Bond Requirements of the Bond, as the same become due. The Federal Securities shall become due before the respective times on which the proceeds thereof shall be needed, in accordance with a schedule established and agreed upon between the County and the bank at the time of the creation of the escrow or trust, or the Federal Securities shall be subject to redemption at the option of the holders thereof to assure availability as needed to meet the schedule. For the purpose of this section "Federal Securities" shall include only Federal Securities which are not callable for redemption prior to their maturities except at the option of the owner thereof.

SECTION 40. **Replacement of Registrar or Paying Agent.** If the Registrar or Paying Agent initially appointed hereunder shall resign, or if the Board shall reasonably determine that said Registrar or Paying Agent has become incapable of performing its duties hereunder, the Board may, upon notice mailed to each owner of any Bond at his or her address last shown on the registration records, appoint a successor Registrar or Paying Agent, or both. No resignation or dismissal of the Registrar or Paying Agent may take effect until a successor is appointed. Every such successor Registrar or Paying Agent shall be either an officer of the County or a banking institution authorized to exercise trust powers having a capital and surplus of not less than \$75,000,000. It shall not be required that the same institution serve as both Registrar and Paying Agent hereunder, but the

County shall have the right to have the same institution serve as both Registrar and Paying Agent. Any successor by merger with the Registrar and Paying Agent is automatically appointed as Registrar and Paying Agent hereunder without any further action of the Board, as long as the successor otherwise qualified to act as Registrar and Paying Agent pursuant to this section.

SECTION 41. **Maintenance of Escrow Account.**

A. The Escrow Account shall be maintained by the County in an amount at the time of those initial deposits therein and at all times subsequently at least sufficient, together with the known minimum yield to be derived from the initial investment and any temporary reinvestment of the deposits therein or any part thereof in Federal Securities, to pay the principal and the interest due in connection with the Refunded Bonds, both accrued and not accrued, as the same become due, for purposes of refunding:

- (1) The 1992A Refunded Bonds;
- (2) The 1987 Bonds maturing September 1, 1994 to September 1,

1996, inclusive;

- (3) The 1987 Bonds maturing September 1, 2001 (the "1987A Refunded Bonds") up to and including September 1, 1994 (the "1987A Redemption Date"); and

- (4) The 1987 Bonds maturing September 1, 2006 (the "1987B Refunded Bonds") up to and including March 1, 1999 (the "1987B Redemption Date"),

and to redeem, on the respective redemption dates, all of the respective Refunded Bonds then outstanding, for the principal amount thereof, accrued interest to the respective redemption dates, and any required premiums.

B. Moneys shall be withdrawn by the Escrow Bank from the Escrow Account in sufficient amounts and at such times to permit the payment without default of the principal of and interest due in connection with the Refunded Bonds. On the 1987A Redemption Date, the County shall call for prior redemption all of the then outstanding 1987A Refunded Bonds, and on the 1987B Redemption Date, the County shall call for prior redemption all of the then outstanding 1987B Refunded Bonds. Any moneys remaining in the Escrow Account after provision

shall have been made for the redemption in full of the Refunded Bonds shall be applied to any lawful purpose of the County as the Board may hereafter determine.

C. If for any reason the amount in the Escrow Account shall at any time be insufficient for its purpose, the County shall forthwith from the first moneys available therefor deposit in such account such additional moneys as shall be necessary to permit the payment in full of the principal, interest and any redemption premium due in connection with the Refunded Bonds as herein provided.

SECTION 42. **Prior Redemption of 1987 Refunded Bonds.** A. The County hereby elects to redeem on September 1, 1994, the 1987A Refunded Bonds at a price equal to the principal amount thereof, accrued interest to the 1987A Redemption Date and the premium designated therefor in the Installment Purchase Agreement, Deed of Trust, Security Agreement, Financing Statement and Declaration of Trust (the "Trust Agreement") between the County and Valley Bank of Nevada, dated as of February 1, 1987.

B. The County hereby elects to redeem on March 1, 1999, the 1987B Refunded Bonds at a price equal to the principal amount thereof, accrued interest to the 1987B Redemption Date and the premium designated therefor in the Trust Agreement.

C. Notice of Prior Redemption for the 1987A Refunded Bonds shall be given in the name of and on behalf of the County by Bank of America Nevada as successor by merger to Valley Bank of Nevada, Trustee under the Trust Agreement, by mailing a copy of a redemption notice by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid at least 20 days and not more than 60 days prior to the 1987A Redemption Date for the 1987A Refunded Bonds to each registered owner of a 1987A Refunded Bond in accordance with the provisions of the Agreement.

D. Notice of Prior Redemption for the 1987B Refunded Bonds shall be given in the name of and on behalf of the County by Bank of America Nevada as successor by merger to Valley Bank of Nevada, Trustee under the Trust Agreement, by mailing a copy of a redemption notice by registered or certified mail, postage prepaid at least 20 days and not more than 60 days prior to the 1987B Redemption Date for the 1987B Refunded Bonds to each registered owner of a 1987B Refunded Bond in accordance with the provisions of the Trust Agreement.

SECTION 43. **Delegated Powers.** The officers and employees of the County are hereby authorized and directed to take all action necessary or appropriate to effectuate the provisions of this Ordinance, including, without limitation:

A. The printing of the Bonds, including, without limitation, and if appropriate, a statement of insurance, if any;

B. The execution of the Escrow Agreement in substantially the form as is currently on file with the County Clerk with such amendments and modifications as agreed to by the Chairman;

C. The execution of such certificates as may be reasonably required by the Purchaser, relating, inter alia,

(1) the signing of the Bonds,

(2) the tenure and identity the officials of the County,

(3) the assessed valuation of the taxable property in and the indebtedness of the County,

(4) the rate of General Taxes levied against taxable property in the County,

(5) the exemption of interest on the Bonds from federal income taxation,

(6) the delivery of the Bonds and the receipt of the Bond purchase price,

(7) the accuracy and completeness of any information provided in connection with the Bonds, including information contained in the official statement for the Bonds,

(8) if it is in accordance with the fact, the absence of litigation, pending or threatened, affecting the validity of the Bonds; and

D. The assembly and dissemination of financial and other information concerning the County and the Bonds.

SECTION 44. **Ordinance Irrepealable.** After any of the Bonds are issued, this Ordinance shall constitute an irrevocable contract between the County and the owner or owners of the Bonds; and this Ordinance, if any Bonds are in fact issued, shall be and shall remain irrepealable until the Bonds, as to all Bond Requirements, shall be fully paid, canceled and discharged, as herein provided.

SECTION 45. **Implied Repealer.** All ordinances, resolution bylaws and orders, or parts thereof, inconsistent herewith are hereby repealed to the extent only of such inconsistency. This repealer shall not be construed to revive any ordinance, resolutions, bylaw or order, or part hereof, heretofore repealed.

SECTION 46. **Emergency.** The Board has expressed in the preambles of this Ordinance that it pertains to the sale, issuance and payment of the Bonds, that this Ordinance may accordingly be adopted as if an emergency now exists, and may become effective at any time when an emergency ordinance of the County may go into effect. Consequently, pursuant to NRS § 350.579 final action shall be taken immediately, and this Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its publication by title as herein provided.

SECTION 47. **Publication and Effective Date.** After this Ordinance is signed by the Chairman and attested and sealed by the Clerk, this Ordinance shall be in effect from and after its publication twice by its title only, together with the names of the Commissioners voting for or against its passage and a statement that typewritten copies of this Ordinance are available for inspection by all interested parties at the office of the County Clerk, such publication to be made in a newspaper published and having a general circulation in the County at least once a week for a period of two weeks, and such publication to be in substantially the following form:



Not more than 60 days nor less than 30 days prior to each sinking redemption date for the Term Bonds, as shown above, the Registrar shall proceed to select for redemption (by lot in such manner as the Registrar may determine) from all outstanding Term Bonds, a principal amount of the Term Bonds, equal to the principal amount of Bonds to be redeemed shown above and shall give notice of the call for redemption as provided in Section 14(D) of this Ordinance.

At the option of the County to be exercised by delivery of a written certificate to the Registrar not less than sixty days next preceding any sinking fund redemption date, it may (i) deliver to the Registrar for cancellation Bonds or portions thereof (\$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof) which otherwise would be called for redemption pursuant to the above mandatory redemption requirement on the next sinking fund redemption date, in an aggregate principal amount desired by the County, or (ii) specify a principal amount of Bonds or portions thereof (\$5,000 or any integral multiple thereof) which otherwise would be called for redemption pursuant to the above mandatory redemption requirement on the next sinking fund redemption date which prior to said date have been redeemed (otherwise than through the operation of the sinking fund) and cancelled by the Registrar and not theretofore applied as a credit against any sinking fund redemption obligation. Each Bond or portion thereof so delivered or previously redeemed shall be credited by the Registrar at 100% of

the principal amount thereof against the obligations of the County on the sinking fund redemption dates and any excess shall be so credited against future sinking fund redemption obligations in such manner as the County determines. In the event the County shall avail itself of the provisions of clause (i) of the first sentence of this paragraph, the certificate required by the first sentence of this paragraph shall be accompanied by the respective Term Bonds or portions thereof to be cancelled or in the event the Bonds are registered in the name of Cede & Co. as provided in Section 17 of this Ordinance, the certificate required by the first sentence of this paragraph shall be accompanied by such direction and evidence of ownership as is satisfactory to The Depository Trust Company.

It was then moved that the 1994 Court Complex and Refunding Bond Ordinance introduced and read by title at this meeting, be now finally passed and adopted as read as an Ordinance of the County, as if an emergency exists. The question being upon the final passage and adoption of such bill as an Ordinance, a vote was taken with the following result:

The presiding officer thereupon declared that at least **TWO-THIRDS** of the members of the Board having voted in favor thereof, such motion was carried and such bill was duly passed and adopted as an Ordinance of Washoe County.

Such Ordinance is to be approved and authenticated by the signature of the Chairman, sealed with the seal of Washoe County attested by the County Clerk, recorded in the minute book of such Board, such record to be signed by such officers and property sealed, and numbered and published by title therein provided.

Thereupon, after considering other matters not concerning the foregoing matters, upon motion duly made and adopted, such meeting was adjourned.


