BILL NO. 1594 ORDINANCE NO. 1415

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 15 OF THE WASHOE COUNTY CODE (COUNTY FINANCES; PURCHASING) BY INCREASING THE PURCHASING LIMIT AND ELIMINATING THE SEPARATE LIMIT FOR KNOWLEDGE BASED SERVICES AND OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO

THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THE COUNTY OF WASHOE DO ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. Section 15.530 of the Washoe County Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

15.530 Duties of purchasing and contracts administrator. The purchasing and contracts administrator shall, subject to the provisions of sections 15.510 to 15.530, inclusive, and applicable provisions of state law, purchase all supplies, materials, equipment and contractual services required by the agencies in annual amounts or estimated annual amounts of \$100,000 or less, and submit to the board of county commissioners for ward all purchases of supplies, materials, equipment and contractual services in annual amounts or estimated annual amounts in excess of \$100,000 in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Purchasing Act.
