





Resource Management with a Heart

- Began in 2012 as part of a Fuels Reduction Project at Galena Creek Regional Park.
- Originally conducted in partnership with Washoe County and the Nevada Division of Forestry:
 - Along with other "Ladder Fuels", White Fir Trees were harvested to improve forest health while reducing wildfire risk.
 - Working with Washoe County Social Services and the Nevada National Guard, 50-60 trees were paired with families with foster and adopted children, as well as those serving active-duty in the Nevada Air and Army National Guard.





- The project is now a vital community program that continues to benefit the forest and families in need.
 - Along with staff from Washoe County Regional Parks and Open Space, CSD Roads and Operations staff have become important partners in the program.
 - Once harvested, CSD Roads crews transport the trees to Rancho San Rafael Regional Park for the distribution event.




























Distribution Event


