

# Park Districts Report December 2018

Open Space and Regional Park Commission Meeting January 15, 2019

## **SOUTH REGION HIGHLIGHTS**

- Bartley Ranch Regional Park was one of KTMB's X-mas tree recycling locations. The event will last until January 7<sup>th</sup>. The trees will be chipped on site, and the chips will be used in parks for weed control and park enhancements.
- At Davis Creek Campground, we are implementing a new reservation system that will make it possible to see and reserve a specific camping spot. There will still be first-come first serve spots available.
- Mayberry Park was the beneficiary of park improvements made by Patagonia and Tom Stille of River Farm School. Patagonia constructed a new parking lot for their facility adjacent to the park, and gained approval from Washoe County Parks to install some pollinator plants and a short walking path near the new parking lot.
