What is PRAC?

- The Park Rangers Association of California is a professional organization created for Park Rangers and other uniformed park employees of municipal, county, special park district, state and federal park agencies in California, and Nevada.
 - Since 1976, PRAC has sought to provide and promote an open forum for sharing experiences, ideas, problems, information, and training. Sample text
 - PRAC seeks to establish statewide professional standards for Rangers through certification, legislation and interagency cooperation.





- Agency Membership Perks
 - As members, Washoe County Uniformed Park Employees have access to a unique forum called PRACnet, used to exchange information, ideas, and problems with employees from other park agencies from across Nevada and California.
 - Quarterly news letter published by fellow park professionals and PRAC members, including Washoe County staff.

 - Director of Region 5 The State of Nevada




- > Training and networking with outside agencies

 - Northern Nevada HOPES Just to name a few...












2020 PRAC Conference update




2020 PRAC Conference update

 - Many of the training sessions will be presented by Washoe County Staff, including staff from Parks, CSD Amin, WCSO and May Arboretum.





- > The Power of Social Media




Training schedule will include:
