ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2020-12

Pursuant to NRS 4.157(c) and JCRRT 21, the Chief Justice of the Peace of Reno Township hereby enters this Administrative Order in response to the State of Emergency declared by Nevada Governor Steve Sisolak on March 12, 2020. To date, Governor Sisolak's declaration has not been rescinded. On March 19, 2020, the Court entered Administrative Order 2020-3, which modified Court operations during the COVID-19 emergency. Specifically, Administrative Order 2020-3 closed most of the Court to in-person access. On May 28, 2020 Governor Sisolak signed Declaration of Emergency Directive 021 and announced that Nevada would enter Phase II of the statewide reopening plan. Emergency Directive 021 states, among other things, that "Nevada's medical experts indicate that the rate at which COVID-19 is spreading in the State of Nevada has effectively slowed to a level that does not jeopardize the state's healthcare system.... and although the danger to Nevadans from the COVID-19 disease has abated, the disease has not been eliminated and measures that protect safety, wellbeing, and public health of Nevadans must remain in effect."

Due to the improvements recognized in Emergency Directive 021, on June 26, 2020 this Court entered Administrative Order 2020-7, which significantly relaxed the restrictions that were put in place by Administrative Order 2020-3 and permitted more in-person access.

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Unfortunately, Nevada, in general, and Washoe County, in particular, have experienced a significant increase in COVID-19 cases over the past several weeks. As stated in the Governor's COVID-19 Weekly Situation Report (released November 13, 2020), "cases, hospitalizations and - tragically - fatalities are on the rise. The fall spike, predicted by all medical and scientific experts, is now our reality."

According to data released by the Washoe County Health District, the average new daily COVID-19 cases in Washoe County has almost quadrupled from fewer than 100 cases per day in early October to almost 400 new cases per day in mid-November. Similarly, a risk assessment (the "Truckee Meadows COVID Risk Meter" available at www.tmrpa.org/covid-wc) created by the Washoe County COVID Task Force currently assesses the COVID-19 risk in our community as "Very High," which is the highest level of risk other than "Severe." The Task Force cautions us as follows: "Case numbers are high and hospital beds are filling up. Only leave your home for essential functions.... Socially isolate as much as possible."

Due to the public safety concerns created by the drastic increase in COVID-19 cases within our community, the Court finds it necessary to again restrict in-person access to the Court. THEREFORE, effective immediately the Court hereby ORDERS as follows:

- (1) Administrative Order 2020-7 is rescinded and supplanted by the terms of this Order. The Reno Justice Court shall continue to accept all court filings and continue to operate while managing cases within the parameters set forth in this Order.
- (2) All parties, counsel, and members of the general public are prohibited from entering Reno Justice Court without a mask or other appropriate face covering. They are further prohibited from entering the Court if they have a body temperature in excess of 100.4°F, as determined by the courthouse Court Security Officers. The following other individuals are similarly prohibited from entering the Court:

- Individuals who have been asked to quarantine or isolate by any doctor, hospital or health agency.
- b. Individuals who have an active case of COVID-19 or who have had close personal contact in the past 14 days with someone who has been diagnosed with COVID-19, unless the individual subsequently tested negative for COVID-19 after having contact with the COVID-positive individual.
- c. Individuals who are currently experiencing symptoms consistent with COVID-19, including an unexplained fever, chills, persistent cough, headaches, body aches and/or shortness of breath.
- (3) The Court is hereby closed for all in-person access and will remain closed for all inperson access during any time where the Truckee Meadows COVID Risk Meter
 registers as "Very High" or "Severe." In-person access shall include but is not
 limited to any and all in-person court proceedings and access to the Court's firstfloor customer-service windows. During this closure, all Court proceedings shall be
 conducted via teleconference and/or video conference.
- (4) If the Truckee Meadows COVID Risk Meter should fall below the threshold of "Very High," the Court may re-open to in-person access on a limited case-by-case basis. During any such re-opening, the Court will operate in the following manner:
 - a. All court proceedings including civil and criminal trials, preliminary hearings, and all other hearings will be conducted via audiovisual technology in lieu of personal, in-court appearances, unless the Court specifically orders otherwise on a case-by-case basis. If any party wishes to request an exception to this provision, the party shall file a written request (with proof of service upon all other parties) for an in-person trial/hearing at least 10 business days prior to the scheduled proceeding. The written request shall specify the

reasons why personal, in-court appearances by the parties and/or witnesses are necessary. Any other party to the case may file a written objection to the request within three calendar days from the date that the request is filed and served. If the request is granted, the parties, counsel, witnesses and any other individuals in the courtroom are required to wear a face covering while on the Reno Justice Court premises, including during the entire proceeding, unless specifically relieved of that obligation by the presiding judge.

- b. The Court's first-floor customer-service windows may reopen to the public, subject to any occupancy and social-distancing requirements that are deemed necessary and appropriate by Court Administration including, but not limited to, requiring all business to be conducted by appointment only.
- (5) If the Truckee Meadows COVID Risk Meter should fall to the threshold of "Moderate" or lower, the Court may resume in-person access in most case types without requiring a party to request an in-person proceeding by written motion.
- (6) During any court closure, payments of fines and fees may still be processed electronically at <u>justicecourts.washoecounty.us/Public/default.aspx</u> or by telephone (775-325-6500).
- (7) Regardless of whether the Court is closed or not, individuals who need to file documents in Court are strongly urged to do so by utilizing the Reno Justice Court drop box located in the courthouse entrance at 1 South Sierra Street; by accessing the Court's electronic filing system (for civil actions only); or by e-mailing an electronic copy of the document to the following e-mail addresses:

a. Civil cases: RJCCivil@washoecounty.us

b. Criminal cases: <u>RJCCriminal@washoecounty.us</u>

c. Citation (traffic) cases: RJCCitations@washoecounty.us

Any documents submitted to the Court for filing shall include a proof of service upon the other party(ies) to the case.

- (8) The second-floor lobby and courtrooms located in Reno Justice Court shall remain closed to members of the general public unless and until the Truckee Meadows COVID Risk Meter falls to the threshold of "Moderate" or lower. Until such time, admittance into court facilities shall be restricted to any parties, witnesses, or attorneys who are specifically authorized to enter the Court on a case-by-case basis. Members of the public and media who wish to enter the Court must make a specific request by calling 775-325-6500. Court Administration may honor such requests by providing opportunities to view Court proceedings via video streaming or similar means.
- (9) Exceptions to this order may be made on a case by case basis upon proper application to the Court in order to facilitate the ends of justice.
- (10) This Order shall remain in effect until it is modified or rescinded by a subsequent order.
