

All assessments are completed by Building Performance Institute (BPI) licensed and certified inspectors through the Nevada Real Estate Division. All work is performed by contractors licensed through either the State Contractors Board or the Manufactured Housing Division, and maintain all required certifications including Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) and are registered through the Nevada Secretary of State's Office.

A free Home Energy Assessment will determine the measures to be installed, such as:


- 1. Building shell and ductwork air sealing
- 2. New ENERGY STAR refrigerator
- 3. Attic, floor and duct insulation
- 4. Air conditioner repair or replacement
- 5. Furnace repair or replacement
- 6. New LED or CFL light bulbs
- 7. New low flow showerhead or faucets
- 8. Water heater repair or replacement
- 9. Programmable thermostat
- 10. Double pane windows
