IN THE ADMINISTRATIVE MATTER OF SETTING MANDATORY STATUS CONFERENCES

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER 2023-06

WHEREAS, the Sparks Justice Court (SJC) had reviewed the provisions of Administrative Order 2021-04 Setting Attorney and Status Conferences;

WHEREAS, the changes made due to reduced inmate transportation from the Washoe County Detention Center due to the COVID pandemic are no longer necessary;

WHEREAS, the Sparks Justice Court has conferred with the offices of the Washoe County District Attorney, the Washoe County Public Defender and the Washoe County Alternate Public Defender;

WHEREAS, the provisions of SJC Administrative Order 2021-04 are no longer necessary and are not the most efficient means to administer the SJC Calendar; and

WHEREAS, the Chief Judge of the Sparks Justice Court has the authority pursuant to NRS 4.157[c] to make administrative decisions pertaining to the business of the Court.

GOOD CAUSE BEING SHOWN,

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- 1. SJC Administrative Order 2021-04 is rescinded as of December 11, 2023.
- Court Clerks will set Mandatory Status Conferences [MSC] at the time of arraignment
 for all criminal matters according to the MSC calendaring practices, if possible, as set
 forth on the Court's website. MSCs will be set in the current status conference sessions,
 Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays.

- 3. All in-custody inmates will be transported to the Court for MSCs. As such, the expectation is that prosecutors and defense counsel will be prepared to discuss the prior offer made by the District Attorney, and either resolve the case or set it for trial or a preliminary hearing.
- 4. All out-of-custody defendants are required to appear for their MSCs, unless otherwise stipulated to by both parties.
- 5. Counsel will be able to continue MSCs by stipulation, on the form provided by the court, for the first or second MSC setting. In order to eliminate the unnecessary transportation of inmates, the stipulations should be received by the Court at least 24 hours in advance of the setting. Any further requests for continuance after the second continuance, must be made in open court before the Judge and will only be granted if good cause is shown, or unless otherwise ordered by the Judge pursuant to stipulation and order.
- 6. Through this new MSC process, the SJC will seek to comply with the following time standards. They are not mandatory at this time, but will be used as a method to evaluate the MSC process. Felony and gross misdemeanor cases should be waived, dismissed or set for preliminary hearing: 65% within 90 days, 85% within 180 days and 96% within 365 days after arraignment. Misdemeanor cases should be resolved, dismissed or set for trial: 85% within 120 days, 98% within 180 days after arraignment.
- 7. This Administrative Order 2023-06 shall stay in full force and effect until amended or rescinded by the Sparks Justice Court.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
